Dear Parishioners,

I want to **THANK YOU** so much for being so generous in your response to the victims of the tornado. The volunteer efforts have been great and continue to persist. **Please pray** for us this week as we are really beginning the **transition from initial response to long term recovery**. We will be meeting this week to discuss and plan efforts to move forward. Catholic Charities, St. Vincent De Paul, and other agencies will be directing the assessments of the genuine needs of those affected. If everything works out there will be a part time Catholic Charities case manager assigned to our area (pray that this comes through) to lead this effort. Catholic Charities is skilled and experienced at disaster response and recovery. I would also like to recognize the **Police Jury** for their hard work. The clean up efforts by the parish have been moving pretty quickly and have been a huge help. They have also been trying hard to get and coordinate as much outside help as possible. If you see your jurors thank them for their service. Another big **THANK YOU to everyone who donated to the relief efforts**. We collected at **total of 9,259.00 thus far**. I am SUPER GRATEFUL for your generosity. These monies along with a portion of funds from other parishes that held a second collections for Catholic Charities for all the tornados in the state will be used to assist with long term recovery. As we mentioned, case managers from Catholic Charities and local St. Vincent De Paul members will be in charge of managing and distributing those funds. I would also like to thank everyone who showed up to assist in our **clean up day**. I am writing this before it happens, but I am presuming it will be fantastic. A big shout out to our volunteer coordinators who are putting together an event that none of us have been responsible for before.

This **Sunday, March 6th**, I will be taking a couple of men from our neighboring parishes to an **Andrew Dinner** (named after St. Andrew – not me) with other prospects for the seminary. The bishop hosts these dinners throughout the year to give potential candidates an opportunity to meet the bishop, some priests, seminarians, and other discerners in an informal atmosphere. **Please pray for those discerning and for our current seminarians. I don't say this causally, but I truly ask your intentional and persistent prayers for our boys**. As we pray for the seminarians we are praying for their fruitful discernment and God's Will for their lives. Odds are not all of them will be called to the priesthood, but we pray that most of them are and will respond with generosity. Those who discern the priesthood is not for them, we are grateful for the formation they received while in seminary. They will certainly be better men for it.

OK...every week I love the **Divine Mercy Novena that we sing after the Monday 6pm Mass** more and more. I was not sure that could happen, but it most certainly is true. After Mass I am flooded by people who are bursting with peace after the service. (continued) **Natural Family Planning and Contraception.** Dr. Caldwell lives in Shriever and works at the **Woman's New Life Center Clinic in New Orleans.** She is going to speak on why the Church teaches that Natural Family Planning is the only moral means of birth regulation, why the Church teaches contraception is immoral, the science behind NFP (which is 99% effective), how NFP can help those who struggle with fertility issues, and the medical dangers of contraceptives (they are carcinogens). This is a don't want to miss talk! I would like to **highly recommend parents and grandparents who have children currently taking birth control for other medical reasons.** **Dr. Caldwell will talk about the medical risks you are taking doing so and other effective and healthy alternatives.**

The **Day of Recollection** was rescheduled for this Saturday at the **St. Elizabeth Community Center from 9am-3pm.** Make sure to sign up so that we know how much food to prepare. This is another don't want to miss opportunity. It will be like a **mini-retreat in our backyard.** The focus will be The Joy of God's Mercy. Talks will be directed at helping us understand, receive, and give God's Mercy more in our lives, as well as how to take full advantage of this Jubilee Year of Mercy.
