Dear Family,

Believe it or not Holy Week is here. In last week's bulletin I wrote about the nature of **Holy Week** and how our participation in the liturgy is one that is a *real participation in the savings events of the Paschal Mystery of Jesus Christ, His Incarnation, Life, Passion, Death, and Resurrection*. We are blessed beyond measure to have this great gift. Many times we do not fully understand the gifts of the Sacraments and even the simple Gospel message itself. This lack of understanding does not allow us to receive the depth of graces that God pours out to us on a daily basis. I would like to remind you of the **treasure chest of incredible educational tools that we now have with www.formed.org**. Ebooks, audio downloads, movies, and different programs (bible studies and such) that teach the Faith in a dynamic and understandable way. I would like to highlight the **Symbolon series**, which goes through the Catholic Faith from the beginning to end. You can start from the first video and watch them all in succession, or you can choose which topics you want to learn most about (the Bible, Mary, the Eucharist, etc.). As we are approaching Easter and Divine Mercy Sunday you can prepare yourself by watching the documentary called, *Oceans of Mercy*. It is about the lives of St. Faustina, St. Maximillian Kolbe, and Pope St. John Paul II and how they were particular instruments of speaking anew the mercy of God for our times. If you have not already signed up you can do so by going checking the bulletin for instructions. Our parish has a **free access code** offered to all parishioners.

I want to personally invite everyone to come to our **Holy Week services this year**. This will be my fifth year celebrating this most sacred of weeks with you and each year has its own particularly moving moments. The washing of the feet and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at Holy Thursday Mass is really beautiful. Good Friday's Commemoration of the Lord's Passion and Veneration of the Holy Cross have a deeply penetrating solemn character. The Easter Vigil Mass is a tour du force of liturgical symbolism and sacramentality. The lighting of the fire, procession of the Paschal Candle, proclamation of Salvation History, blessing of baptismal waters, and celebration of the Holy Eucharist combine for a mystical experience. So... basically, if you want to have a beautiful encounter with Jesus in the heart of the Church come join us. See the bulletin for details of place and time.

As our state and region continue to recover from the recent tornados and now massive floods I ask your continued prayers and support for all involved. Please go to the **Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Baton Rouge's website www.ccdiobr.org** to donate to the cause of helping families in our diocese affected by the tornados and floods. **As many of you have learned St. Joseph's Abbey and Seminary College (aka St. Ben's), where 13 of our 20 seminarians are currently in formation was inundated with over two feet of water**. Every building on the property minus the Abbey Church (by inches) was flooded. The Abbey and seminary did not have flood insurance. The last information that I received is that they have been told FEMA will cover 75% of the damages, but the remaining 25% will have to come from private sources. I am not sure how that will actually play out, but nonetheless, the Abbey will need our support in restoring the largest college seminary in the U.S.. Enrollment has more than doubled since I (continued)

(continued) graduated in 2004. It is now over 140. **You can donate to the cause by visiting www.helptheabbey.com. Please pray for the monks, the seminarians and all involved.**

Praised be Jesus Christ that our country has finally declared the persecution of Christians and other religious minorities by ISIS in the Middle East a GENOCIDE. It is atrocious what they are doing to the oldest Christian communities in the world. Katherine Jean Lopez wrote a great editorial in the Advocate recently. Part of it documents some of the stories of what is going on there. It reads, "A Christian man from Mosul who committed suicide after he had to watch as ISIS fighters 'brutally raped his wife and daughter in front of him.' [A] woman who 'was victimized so often that she resorted to defecating on herself to make herself less desirable and had to be trained to use the bathroom again after she escaped.'" According to the [Knights of Columbus] report, **'ISIS is estimated to have taken over 1,500 Yazidi and Christian girls as sex slaves. They are bought and sold on an open slave market and are often raped in rapid succession by a number of fighters in a single night.'** And these are just some of the horrors we know." Please PRAY, PRAY, AND PRAY for them. Pray for the humble conversion of ISIS. **Petition our governmental leaders to do what is needed to stop this horrendous genocide. Go to www.stopthechristiangenocide.org to educate yourself, contact those in power, and spread the message.** It is much needed.
