Dear Family,

It looks like the weather has continued its ornery ways with all of the torrential rainfall in the South. We have had so many people offer their prayers, support, and resources in our recent tornado experience, please offer your prayers for those affected by the flooding and ask the Lord if there is any way you can help those affected. He will direct our hearts. Due to the rain we cancelled a meeting on Thursday that had as its purpose the development of a committee to focus on long term recovery for those affected by the tornado in our area. The next big issue is looking for housing for those who lost their homes and do not have homeowners insurance. Please keep them and the formation of the team in your prayers. On that note I would like to offer a **heartfelt THANK YOU** to everyone who came out for the **clean up day**. We had a great crew! People came from as far as Houma and Baton Rouge to help out. Maybe further? I didn't get a chance to meet everyone. Your hard work, love, and dedication is much appreciated.

We also rescheduled **Dr. Susan Caldwell's presentation on Life and Love: NFP and Contraception. The new date is Thursday, April 14th, at 6:30pm in the St. Elizabeth Community Center.** As I mentioned before you really don't want to miss this talk. You can learn more about her at www.womansnewlife.com. Just another reminder to sign up for **Flocknote** if you have not already done so. If you go to our website www.sesjchurch.com and click on the blue and white lamb icon in the top right corner it will direct you to sign up for messages from the parish. You can get **emails, texts, or even phone calls**. No worries we don't pester you, just updates and information about parish events. It certainly helps when stuff like this happens – cancelations and such – to get a notification in real time.

Next Sunday is **Palm Sunday**, which is the beginning of Holy Week for us. By the miraculous grace of God every single Mass we celebrate is a *re-presentation* – not a representation as in a picture or painting, but a new presentation of the actual event – of the Saving Mysteries of Jesus Christ. **We are mystically present at the Last Supper, Via Dolorosa, Crucifixion, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ as if it were happening here and now.** It is very easy for us to lose sight of this and just find ourselves going through the “motions” of the Mass. One of the main gifts that the Church gives to shake us out of potentially falling into a “programmatically” living of our faith is **Holy Week**. During Holy Week we stop to give an even deeper focus to these world changing events. It begins with Christ's entrance into Jerusalem in which the crowds hailed Him as king. “Hosanna! Son of David.” Hosanna means, “Save us!” They (*and now we*) are recognizing Him as the prophesied Messiah and calling Him to fulfill His mission. On Wednesday all of the priests of the Diocese of Baton Rouge will be at the cathedral for the **Chrism Mass** at which the bishop will bless all of the holy oils – Chrism, Oil of the Sick, and Oil of Catechumens – to be used for the entire year in the diocese. Each parish and diocesan apostolate sends representatives to the Mass to receive the oils on behalf of their community. On **Holy Thursday** we will celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper. At this Mass we particularly commemorate the Institution of the Holy Eucharist and the Priesthood of Jesus Christ. These are treasures from the Heart of Jesus. Pray that we (*continued*)

(continued) understand and appreciate them more and more – including me! At this Mass the priest also washes the feet of 12 people enacting Christ’s humility in doing the same for His Apostles. On **Good Friday** we celebrate the Commemoration of the Lord’s Passion and the Veneration of the Holy Cross. This is such a beautiful and sanctifyingly solemn liturgy. On Saturday evening we celebrate the most sacred of all Liturgies, the **Easter Vigil**. This is such a moving, moving liturgy. We begin outside in the dark with the blessing of the fire and the blessing of the Paschal Candle, which represents Christ who was crucified and is now Risen. He is the Light of the World. As we enter the church the congregations’ candles are lit and the Liturgy of the Word begins. The main passages that tell the story of Salvation History are proclaimed and reflected upon. Then the baptismal waters are blessed and we renew the graces and promises of our own baptism. From there the Liturgy of the Eucharist is celebrated and we conclude with the reception of Him Who is Our Light. There is certainly much more than that, but those are some of the highlights. Please mark your calendars for these blessed liturgies. Also, don’t forget about our **Divine Mercy Mass at 3pm on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 3rd**. There will be no 8:30am Mass that weekend.

Also, don’t forget that Good Friday is a day of fasting, penance, and abstinence, therefore no crawfish boils and parties on Good Friday – save those for the entire Easter Season which is 50 days of nonstop Easter feasting!
