Dear Family,

**Happy Easter!** That's right we are only on Day Eight of 50 days of Easter. And this Eighth Day is one fantastic day for sure, **Divine Mercy Sunday**. As I have mentioned before in private revelations to St. Faustina Kowalska, Jesus Himself asked for a special feast to honor His Mercy. The following is taken from

*"In a series of revelations to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s, our Lord called for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. Today, we know that feast as Divine Mercy Sunday, named by Blessed John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30, 2000.*

*The Lord expressed His will with regard to this feast in His very first revelation to St. Faustina. The most comprehensive revelation can be found in her Diary entry 699: **My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy.***

*In all, St. Faustina recorded 14 revelations from Jesus concerning His desire for this feast.*

While we as Catholics are not bound to assent in faith to private revelation, in both declaring St. Faustina a canonized saint and naming the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, the Church has given strong support for this beautiful feast.

In this Year of Mercy let us do the same. **Make sure to log in on [www.formed.org](http://www.formed.org) to view the 10 part series on Divine Mercy: what it truly is, its roots in Scripture, and how the Lord used the lives of Pope St. John Paul, St. Maximillian Kolbe, and St. Faustina to be messengers of His Mercy in this particular period of history.**

Jesus has also promised special graces for the dying when the chaplet is prayed for and with them during their dying hours. I continue to hear stories of grace and peace for families as they pray this beautiful prayer with their loved ones while they are dying. I strongly encourage you to take up this chaplet in your personal prayer and to pray with and for those who are dying especially. Let's take up Jesus on His word. I would highly recommend any parents and grandparents who have children who are currently or potentially taking contraceptives for other medical reasons to attend. Dr. Caldwell will tell you about the medical dangers associated with taking contraceptives, such as they are cancer causing agents, and other healthy ways to deal with those same issues. For **couples struggling with infertility** she will also speak about the effectiveness of NaPro technology in achieving pregnancy. You don't want to miss her talk!
