My brothers and sisters in Christ,

The summer heat and humidity is upon us! It is nice to see some break in the daily showers. I am hoping it will dry somewhat so I can get some walks in around the canefields once again. They have become a great place for me to get some quiet time in with the Lord as well as a place to pray my rosary. It is my hope that all of you are enjoying the summer time now whether it is a chance to get some travel time in, some readings and relaxing, or just happy that the cool weather is gone.

As I said in a previous bulletin article, this month is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Some in the parish may have grown up with this devotion in their home especially with the image of the Sacred Heart in a prominent place. Statues of the Sacred Heart of Jesus can be found at St. Elizabeth to the right of the high altar and above the tabernacle in the St. Martin Chapel. Some of you may have only recently started this devotion and desiring to know more. I did not know about this devotion until I entered the seminary. The Sacred Heart of Jesus is an important devotion that focuses on the divine love that Jesus has for each one of us despite our weakness and sinfulness. It is a devotion that that begun around 1672 due in part to the visions received by Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque in France. As one source describes this devotion, "There are two things that must always be found together in the devotion to the Sacred Heart: Christ's Heart of flesh and Christ's love for us. True devotion to the Sacred Heart means devotion to the Divine Heart of Christ insofar as His Heart represents and recalls His love for us." It is something that I need to be constantly reminded of.

One of the prayers that focus on the Sacred Heart is the Offering. It is prayer that I know the students at St. Elizabeth School say every morning as part of their assembly. Maybe you have never heard of this prayer. At the end of this article will be the prayer. I encourage you to pray it sometime this week and consider praying each morning as you begin the day.

Finally, as a mentioned in my previous article, next Friday June 23rd is the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. For this feast day, we are going to have Mass in St. Elizabeth Church at 7:40am. Immediately following the Mass, everyone present will have an opportunity to do an Act of Consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Handouts will be provided for this at the Mass. I will place a copy on our website for those who would like to do this at home or at another time.
