Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

This past Friday the Church celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. Along with this feast day, this month is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Some of you may have grown up with this devotion in your home especially with the image of the Sacred Heart in a prominent place. Statues of the Sacred Heart of Jesus can be found at St. Elizabeth to the right of the high altar and above the tabernacle in the St. Martin Mission Chapel. Some of you may have only recently started this devotion and desiring to know more. I did not know about this devotion until I entered the seminary.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus is an important devotion that focuses on the divine love that Jesus has for each one of us despite our weakness and sinfulness. It is a devotion that that begun around 1672 due in part to the visions received by Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque in France. As one source describes this devotion, "There are two things that must always be found together in the devotion to the Sacred Heart: Christ's Heart of flesh and Christ's love for us. True devotion to the Sacred Heart means devotion to the Divine Heart of Christ insofar as His Heart represents and recalls His love for us." It is something that I need to be constantly reminded of. One of the prayers that focus on the Sacred Heart is the Morning Offering. It is a prayer that I know the students at St. Elizabeth School say every morning as part of their assembly. One the daily devotional I have ends their message with this prayer. Maybe you have never heard of this prayer. At the end of this article will be the prayer. I encourage you to pray it sometime this week and consider to add it to your morning routine as you begin the day.

Praying the Rosary

Familiarize yourself and/or your group with the prayers of the rosary.

1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
2. Holding the Crucifix, say the *Apostles' Creed*.
3. On the first bead, say an *Our Father*.
4. Say one *Hail Mary* on each of the next three beads.
5. Say the *Glory Be*
6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery (perhaps followed by a brief reading from Scripture) then say the *Our Father*.
7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten *Hail Marys* while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*.
(After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: *O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.*)
8. After saying the five decades, say the *Hail, Holy Queen*, followed by this dialogue and prayer:
V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.
R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.
Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

(A prayer to St Joseph may also follow.) Conclude the Rosary with the Sign of the Cross.
